THE MARPLES (MISSION AVIATION FELLOWSHIP)

"Are you kidding me?" If I heard that question once over the last 12 months, I heard it 20 times. And always in relation to one of our students. Let's call him "George". Not his real name. Not from Canada. George came to Prairie over a year ago, not too long after we arrived here ourselves. George already held a commercial pilot license; had already had his first flying job. He was coming to us to train for his multi-engine and instrument flight ratings. These are required to fly aircraft with more than one engine, and to fly inside the clouds. It was supposed to be a relatively quick sojourn at PATC. God had other ideas.

In that first flying job George had experienced the darker side of small aircraft companies. Operating on limited budgets with razor thin profits margins, some companies are not able to provide excellent levels of training and oversight. George had a couple of adventures that had drained his confidence levels. After my first flight with George, it was clear that the task was to be more complex than first imagined. Training that should have taken us a couple months proceeded at the pace of rush hour traffic in downtown Toronto: stop—start—stop—start. The personal crisis were never-ending: health, family deaths, financial issues. "Are you kidding me?" was the refrain echoed amongst instructors when a new text would arrive from George canceling yet another training flight.

Last week, George passed his multi-engine instrument rating flight test with flying colours. Gone was the timid, unsure person we met last year. Up at altitude, the winds on the day were howling at 110 km/hour. That's a sufficient strong breeze to make even the staunchest, most experienced pilot sit up and take notice. Yet when the flight test examiner asked if George really wanted to go flying, there was no hesitation: confidence had been restored!

Staff and students gather for chapel at the airport on Monday and Thursday mornings. George asked if he could speak before he left us. In accordance with our tradition—he who passes a flight test provides the goodies—George arrived with boxes of donuts and his story. When he came to Prairie, George was looking for something more than just excellent flight training; he was searching for God. On Monday, he wanted us all to know that he has found "it". Not that this was a huge secret; it was obvious. We had seen George grow not just in confidence, but in certainty of hope for the future. His testimony took us through his long and tortuous road, particularly the last 12 months. It was a privilege to walk alongside George through his personal "valley of the shadow of death" and to see why God had led him to our school. In New Guinea they say you can see Jesus in the eyes of believers. Not there when George arrived, Jesus certainly was in his eyes when George left.
